About Program

Prelims with time has become one of the most difficult stages to clear because of its very nature of being the largest eliminating stage.

OUTCOME ORIENTED PRELIMS REVISION PROGRAM

- ➤ A program of 30-45 days for effective and quick revision of the static part of the syllabus.
- **► Strategy: 3 Days Live Zoom Session**.
 - You will be guided to study the topics effectively in the limited time.
 - You'll be given time there and then in the session. You have to complete the reading/ revision of that particular topic in that time.
 - Major points, most important facts will be highlighted which students shouldn't miss.
 - Appropriate PYQs, logical techniques, value additions will also be discussed.
 - Specific focus on difficult, complex, ignored and important topics
- ➤ Rest 4 Days- You have to complete things at your own pace. Readings and Revisions of the remaining topics and Revisions of the topics discussed in the live class.

Solving tests beyond the capacity

- Of Course, you should solve as many tests as possible, but this doesn't mean solving 150 tests without analyzing the previous ones.
- Ideally, you should solve a minimum of 30-35 tests. Only after you have analysed them, should you move on to the next tests.

▶ Not Solving Quality Tests

- Solving average or poor quality tests can only give you temporary satisfaction, and not results. Unfortunately, most test series today in market aren't well aligned with the changing needs and the demand of UPSC
- At SOMP, our aim is very simple to give absolute quality and relevance in all the tests.

▶ Not analysing the tests, and harping on scores rather than the learnings.
