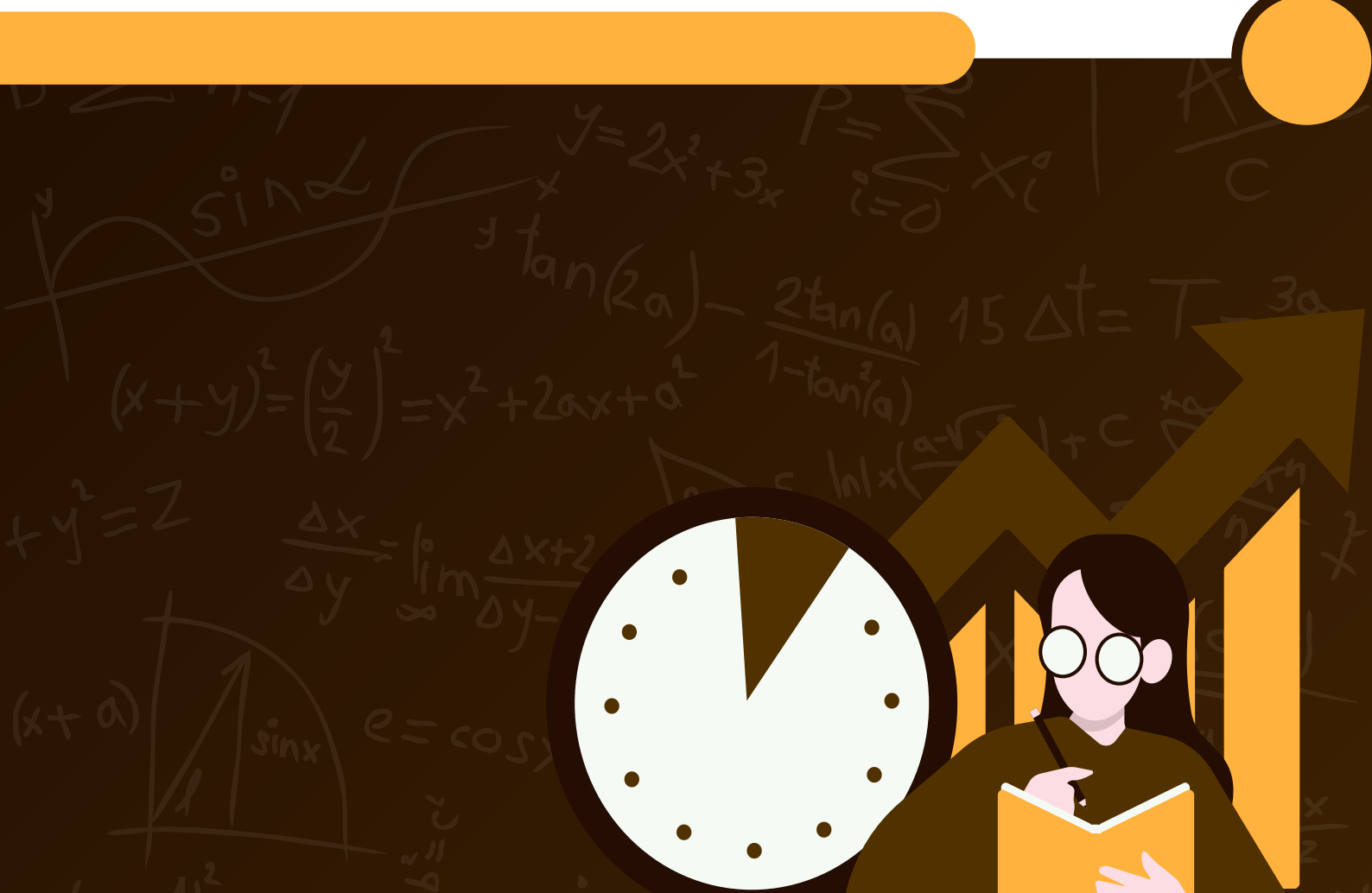
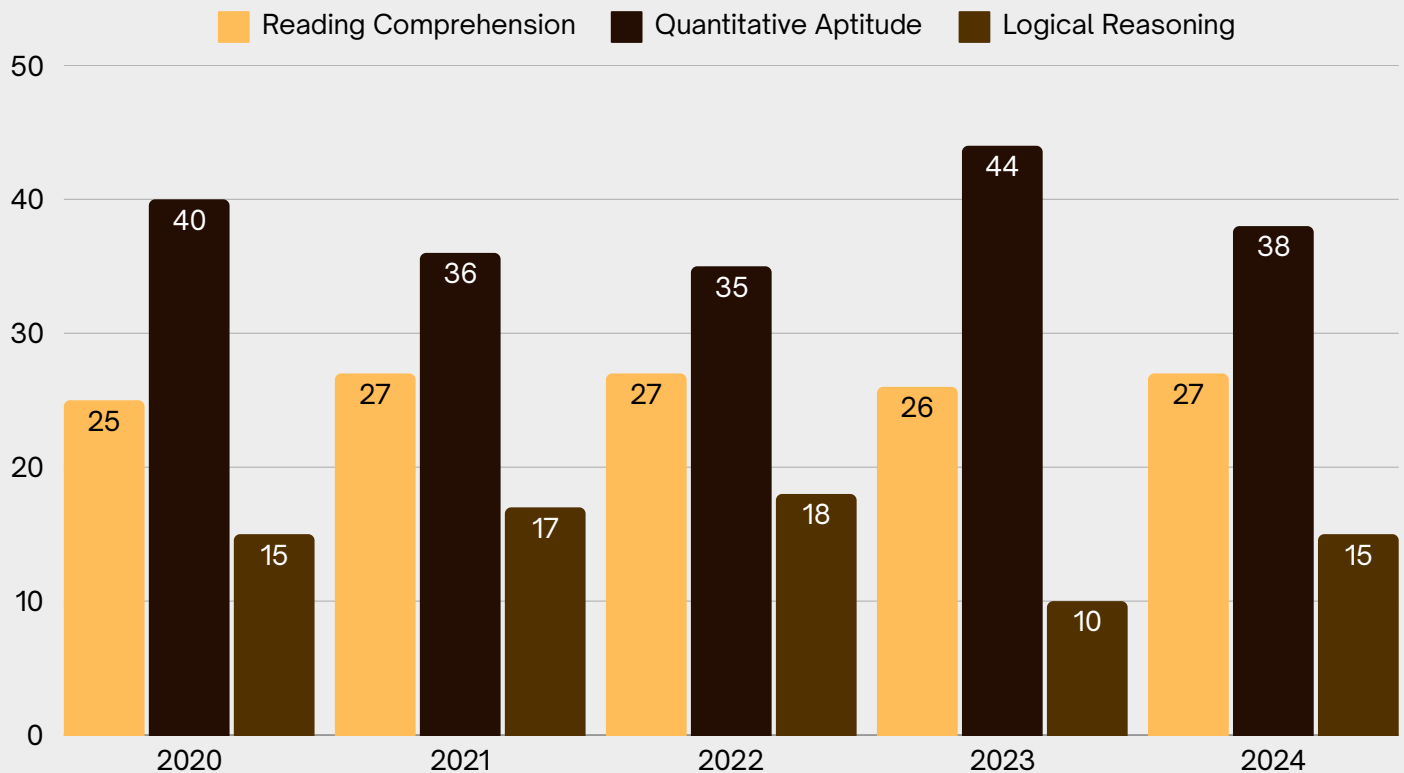

Summary of Trends



The CSAT nightmare continues...

● A noticeable trend has been observed in the CSAT paper in the last few years where along with the difficulty and diversity of the questions, the length and comprehensibility of the questions have also been posed as an obstacle to an otherwise easy paper to handle.

● This emerging trend calls for an increased effort and attention towards this paper both inside and outside the exam hall. Even the slightest of negligence of CSAT paper on the part of aspirants can spell doom to their one whole attempt and can turn into a mass massacre as witnessed by many in Prelims 2023

Key Observations

Quantitative Aptitude

There has been a significant increase in the number of questions from this section in recent years, peaking at 42 questions in 2020. This indicates a growing emphasis on numerical ability. Though this part demands a lot of practice, this is easily one of the most scoring parts of this exam.



Reading Comprehension

The number of questions has remained relatively stable, ranging between 26 to 31 questions annually. This consistency underscores the importance of strong comprehension skills. Unlike other such exams where the reading speed and accuracy are tested, in this exam the comprehension and a deeper understanding of the topic are needed to score



Logical Reasoning

This section has seen fluctuations, with a notable decrease in questions in 2020 (12 questions) and an increase in 2022 (22 questions). This variability suggests the need for balanced preparation across all sections. However, when approached with right practice and mindset, the likelihood of getting all the answers correct in this section increases tremendously.

Apart from this course, only a very little effort from the side of aspirants will be needed in the form of solving the pyqs, some practice assignments, and full mocks.



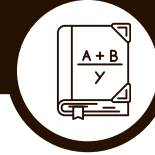

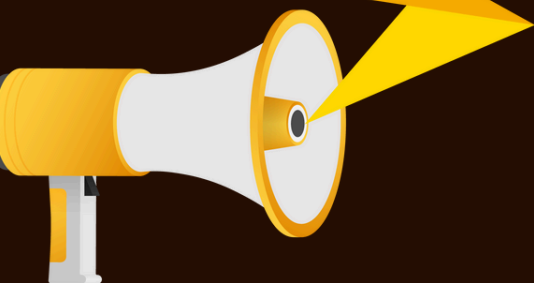
